## Mode of Instruction

All subjects are delivered in the distance learning mode using interactive print and internet-based materials.

Students use specially packaged learning materials. These materials are prepared by a team of experts composed of a subject specialist as writer, content and style critic, language editor, and media specialist.

An important element of distance education is the tutorial session. Tutorials provide students with the opportunity to interact with their tutors and peers. Online learning methods, like internet chat, are used to optimize learning.

Student performance is assessed through assignments, exercises and activities, and supervised examinations.
